About the Internship

Power for All is seeking a motivated individual to support our Powering Agriculture Campaign. This is a unique opportunity to gain valuable experience at an international nonprofit while assisting with stakeholder mapping and research, supporting media outreach efforts, and administrative support. This internship will expose you to the decentralized renewable and energy access sectors and nonprofit operations at an international level. Our goal is to offer an integrated experience drawing on our intern's interests and strengths while meeting our program needs and fostering new skills.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Keep an up-to-date database of companies, contacts, and other organizations to engage with for the campaign, including ongoing research on journalists and topics to write about
- Organize research and knowledge products coming out of the Powering Ag campaign and efforts in Uganda.
- Provide logistical support as needed on webinars, workshops, and podcasts, including scheduling, confirming attendance, and managing technical logistics (for events including the UN Food Systems Summit).
- Build out media lists and event lists; Clean, re-organize mailing lists (MailChimp, etc)
- Help schedule meetings with potential and existing partners, ensure timely follow-ups, take notes on calls and share with team
- Support programmatic leads with administrative support to the team as needed
